Meet Steve VanMeter

Steve VanMeter, long-time resident of Gibbon, became the first Commander of the Bradley Buck Post #310 Sons of the American Legion (SAL) in 2008. He retained the office for three years and organized many projects that supported Veterans and current military personnel. Steve said, "I became involved in starting the SAL after Mick Ross told me about the organization. I never knew it existed and my Mom and Dad were involved in many Veteran organizations." Steve became involved with the



Steve's father, Dale, ran away at the age of 16 and enlisted in the United States Army. His older sister forged the permission slip so he could join. Dale's mom had died at his birth and he and his two sisters were "farmed" out to other families. The Crissie Ellmers' family took in Dale and raised him until he left for the military. Steve said, "I thought everyone had three granddads. I first met my biological grandfather, Martin Van Matre, when he was stationed at Ft. Riley, Kansas." Steve pointed out that his last name has a different spelling than his grandfather's and has no explanation for it. Martin served in the Army during both WWI and WWII.

Dale VanMeter was assigned to the 711th Tank Battalion. Steve recalled his

dad talking about the Lousiana Maneuvers. Dale's unit rode horses from Arkansas to Ft. Robinson, Nebraska. Once they arrived at Ft. Robinson, the horses were taken away and the men were given tanks; they turned into mechanized units. Steve remembers his dad saying, "I rode a perfectly good horse to Ft. Robinson and then they put me in a god-damned tank." Dale was stationed in Needles, California, when Pearl Harbor was bombed. He was sent to Okinawa where he was wounded when his tank was hit. Dale was awarded the Purple Heart.

"My dad talked about the Army but never the War! My dad was discharged just under 5 years of service." Shortly after his discharge, Dale turned 22. He returned to Lyle, Kansas, and married Dorothy. They had three children: Janice Pollatt (Kearney), Steve and Mary Westerbeck (Wellsville, Kansas). Steve said that his dad knew his mom's family growing up as their family farms were only five miles apart. Dale was a life member of three Veteran organizations: American Legion Post #310 in Arapahoe, Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Chapter 14 and Veterans of Foreign Wars 9357. His mom was recognized at the state level for her efforts with the DAV before her death in 1984. Dale died May 1996 in Kearney.

Steve and his sisters grew up in Oakley, Kansas. "My dad owned body shops when I was a kid; he was a migrant fender and body man. One day, my dad came home at noon and told my mom that he sold the shop and the next day the moving van came to put our stuff in storage and we moved to Bakersfield, California, where my dad worked in an auto shop." Dale took his family to Arapahoe were Steve met his wife, Julia Monter. Both Steve and Julia graduated from Arapahoe High School in 1967 before earning their degrees at McCook Jr. College and attended Kearney State College; both graduated with teaching degrees. They married in 1970, Steve's first job was in Shelton and Julia's was in Wood River. They moved to Gibbon in 1973 when Steve accepted the elementary principal position. He retired from Gibbon Public Schools in 2003 and served as the

County Superintendent of the Class I schools until they closed in 2006. Steve and Julia have three sons: Kris married Kathy and they have four children: Karlie, Brayan, Avery, & Pallmer. Nate married Julie and they have two children: Emily & Lydia. Jon married Kristin and they have two children: Landon & Preston. Steve and Julia make many trips to the Lincoln area as their children and families all live in or close to Lincoln.

Steve has many mementos from his father and grandfather. "Cris Ellmers was not my biological grandfather, but I knew him as my granddad." Cris served in WWI and Steve inherited all of his military papers, and uniforms. Steve said, "He had to wear his boots and overcoat in the depression and wore them out. Otherwise he had everything." Steve has the gas mask that Cris was wearing in France when mustard gas was used on the US troops. Dale received 100% disability because of his injuries. Steve is proud of a shadowbox of his Dad's mementos that now hangs in his bedroom. The shadowbox contains Dale's grade school picture, his purple heart, Dale's mother's blue-star pin, his 50 year Legion pin, Cris's 60 year Legion pin, shells from the Phillippines, Hawaii and Okinawa and a toy lion that Dale's grandmother gave him. Cris Ellmers died in the late 1960's and Martin Van Matre died in the mid-1950's. Steve also had three uncles who served in the United States Army; one was a career intelligence officer, another served in Korea and the third served in a Redstone Missile Arsenal.
